Greetings!

Earlier this year Pope Francis wrote in a letter of his admiration for Saint Anthony of Padua, who the Church celebrates on June 13. "His example of sharing with the difficulties of families, the poor and disadvantaged, as well as his passion for truth and justice, can still arouse a generous commitment to give oneself today, in the sign of fraternity," the pope said.

There is so much to write about Saint Anthony; I dare not summarize his life of the early 13th century. So if you have time to dawdle on the net, "Google" him and check it out. Here clearly is an extraordinary man who lived and loved for Christ. But as I was reading about him, this Pope Francis quote stuck in my head as something to contemplate.

Much has been written and Catholics have been discussing Pope Francis since he sat in the chair of Saint Peter. Regardless of your personal stance on his papacy, his act of self-sacrifice, to sit in that chair, is the love of Christ in action. Pope Francis has visited over 30 countries in the world, some very difficult places to be Catholic, other places of great suffering. His published work is ground-breaking and controversial.

What struck me about his quote about Saint Anthony of Padua is this: it could easily have been said by a Catholic priest about the Pope himself. Pope Francis has demonstrated again and again his love of the family, his love of the poor and disadvantaged, and his passion for truth and justice. Like Saint Anthony of Padua, the pope is a man, albeit an extraordinary man, who gives us a model of generous commitment to sharing the love and peace of Christ, in the sign of fraternity.

Fraternal care of the Body of Christ for all humanity is now in crisis. American culture has not reacted well to the health crisis of a novel virus. The marginalized are left behind whenever we adopt a "everyone stands alone" attitude. In some places, violence has replaced the polling place in a misguided destruction of personal property and the injuries and loss of life that accompany hostile mobs. Troubling, indeed.

So where do I stand on all this? I look to the Bishop and Pope for guidance, knowing their examples of sharing the difficulty of families, the poor and disadvantaged, and their passion for truth and justice will help me to give generously. My gift must come from time, talent, and treasure in a sign of fraternity. All the while knowing how badly I need the Lord's mercy and forgiveness.

For the sake of his sorrowful passion, have mercy on us, and on the whole world.
