# A CPC REFLECTION

Greetings! My name is Jaclyn Walters. I am coordinating St. Joan of Arc's Catholic Parishes Campaign. Each parish has a goal. If it is not reached, we must find the remaining balance in our budget. If we go over our goal, the additional amount will be returned to our Parish.

I thought long and hard about what to say to you about our CPC collection. I keep coming around to my favorite verse and why we give.

I have had several favorite verses throughout the different seasons of my life, but right now it is Ephesians 3:20 that stays on my heart. In Ephesians 3:20, St. Paul tells us, "God is able to do immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine by His power that is at work within us." You might think I am a little crazy for loving this verse. My husband Aaron does!

I never expected a letter from St. Paul to find its way into my heart. But Ephesians 3:20 means so much to me. When I pray for our Church, our congregation, and Fr. John, I pray my boys will be able to have their confirmation at St. Joan of Arc, their wedding at

## ❖ **Summary of the Diocesan Pastoral Council Meeting, September 19, 2020**

The Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) met on September 19 at the Catholic Center in Evansville. The DPC is a consultative body to Bishop Siegel. Following Mass, Bishop Siegel opened the meeting by explaining that then Bishop Charles Thompson promulgated a Diocese of Evansville Pastoral Plan in 2016. Several significant developments have since occurred, such as the reorganization of parishes and the Stewards of God's Grace Capital Campaign. Bishop Siegel is asking priests, the DPC, and diocesan department directors to review the 2016 plan so as to offer their recommendations on diocesan pastoral priorities. Dr. Tad Dickel of T.A. Dickel Group, LLC, facilitated DPC discussion. The DPC identified many significant developments that have occurred since 2016, discussed what they liked about the 2016 plan, and what could be improved and clarified. Following that, DPC members offered suggestions about broad diocesan priorities moving forward. The meeting concluded with some final comments from the Bishop and an opportunity for Q&A. The next meeting is scheduled for November 7, 2020.
