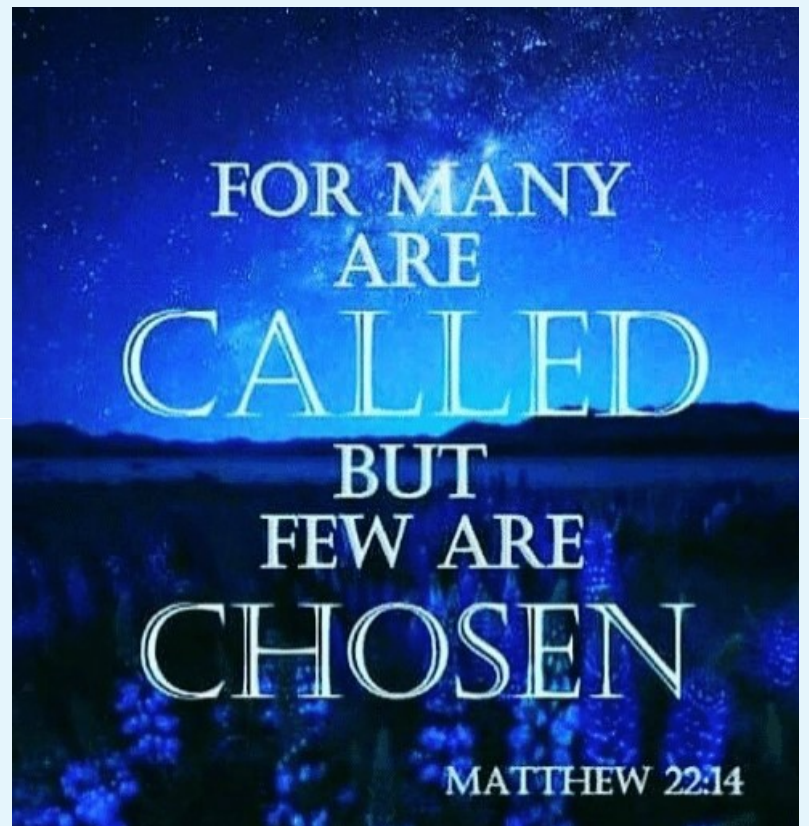

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

We all understand feelings of anxiety or worry; Jesus pointed out the improvident nature of worry. "Can any of you by worrying add a moment to your life-span? If even the smallest things are beyond your control, why are you anxious about the rest?" (Luke 11:25-26) This passage is straightforward, and it clearly shows the wasted time and helplessness of worry.

And in this day and age we have a long-list of worries to overcome: the pandemic, masks, a deadly virus, racial unrest in urban areas, the CPC assessment, decreasing tithes, laid-off workers, drought, and the desperation of people on the margin. So how might a person not dwell on the myriad worries of modern life?

Working on our trust in the Lord is paramount. If things seem outside of our control, accept that God has your back and move forward in courage. Sometimes the answer may seem as easy as becoming busy with good works. Jesus said, "Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy." Our good works are wealth in heaven by the words of Jesus.

Being informed can also help with worry. Researching those things that make you worry might help you prepare to NOT worry. For instance, if you study COVID, you will be more prepared to take the proper precautions to remain healthy. Or another example is, if we fail to make our CPC Assessment, we are blessed by those who came before us to build up our savings. We want savings to remain good, but it is comforting to know that we have savings.

Finally, the biggest counterbalance of worry is prayer; intercessory prayer asks for the Lord's intervention. Praying for that of which you worry, or praying for God to take your worry, are both strategies to use the power of prayer on worry.

If you feel like you are in the "I worry too much" category, talk to your family and friends about it. Sometimes sharing fears and worry causes one to be "desensitized" to it. Taking it to confession is also a way to relieve your mind from worry outside your control.
