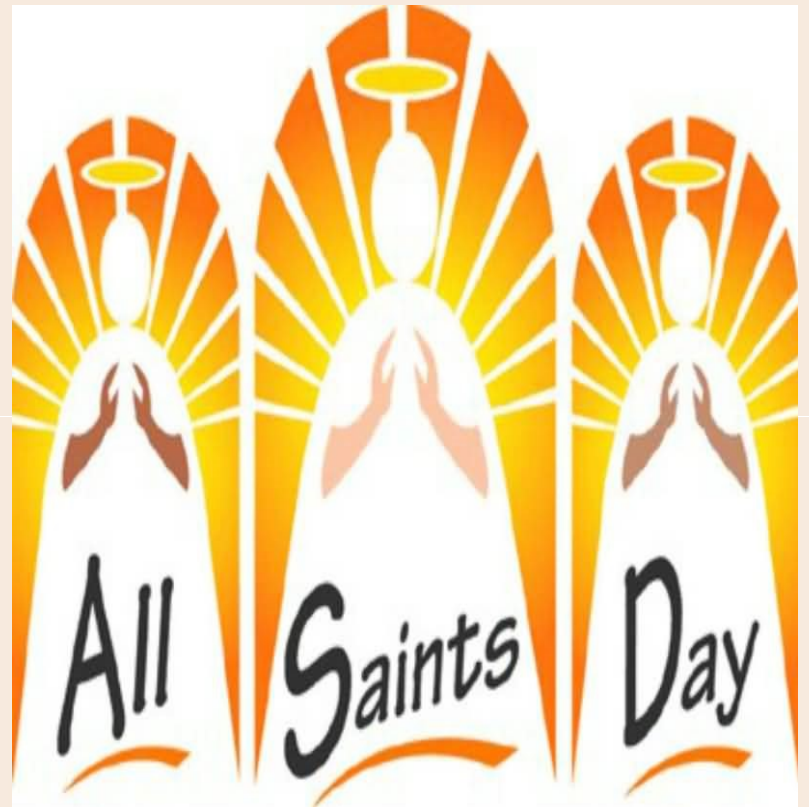

A REFLECTION

FROM DEACON ALBERT

Today we celebrate All Saints Day. This is a day intended to honor everyone who has come to share in the heavenly life – and not just those that the Church has officially declared to be saints. Today we celebrate all those who have completed their journey with Christ into the Promised Land of heaven.

In our Gospel reading today, we hear Jesus in his Sermon on the Mount proclaiming the Beatitudes, basically instructing us in “How to be a Saint.” Sometimes the Beatitudes seem like ideals which are just too hard, or in our stubbornness we might think they are only for those who are naïve, but not practical in today’s world. But today we remember those men and women who really embraced these ideals and took them to heart. We remember those who were taught by the Spirit to learn from the Wisdom of Christ.

Today, there are a great number of Christians who are strengthened each day to seek the face of Christ; strengthened by the Holy Spirit. Some do so in spite of persecution and tribulation. Around the world, many of our brothers and sisters are mistreated, and even killed, because of

their Christian faith as they take the teachings of Jesus to heart. And the witness of these saints gives us hope, and courage. But there are also the small sacrifices offered each day for Christ; for truth, goodness, and love. Think, for example, of how often you might have had to be a peacemaker or be merciful at home or at work. We have so many opportunities to put into practice the teachings of our Lord in all aspects of our daily lives. And all of this is possible because of God’s grace, because of an openness to the Holy Spirit.

The path to holiness begins with an acknowledgement that we are sinners, and a longing for God’s mercy and salvation. That path winds through our towns and neighborhoods, our workplaces and homes, throughout our everyday lives and into our hearts. For it is here in these places that we hunger and thirst for righteousness; that we can seek God with a pure and undivided heart. And God’s response is always to fill us with his blessing, giving us a share in the very life of the Blessed One, so that - if we persevere in friendship with God - we might ourselves become Blessed, and join the company of his saints.
