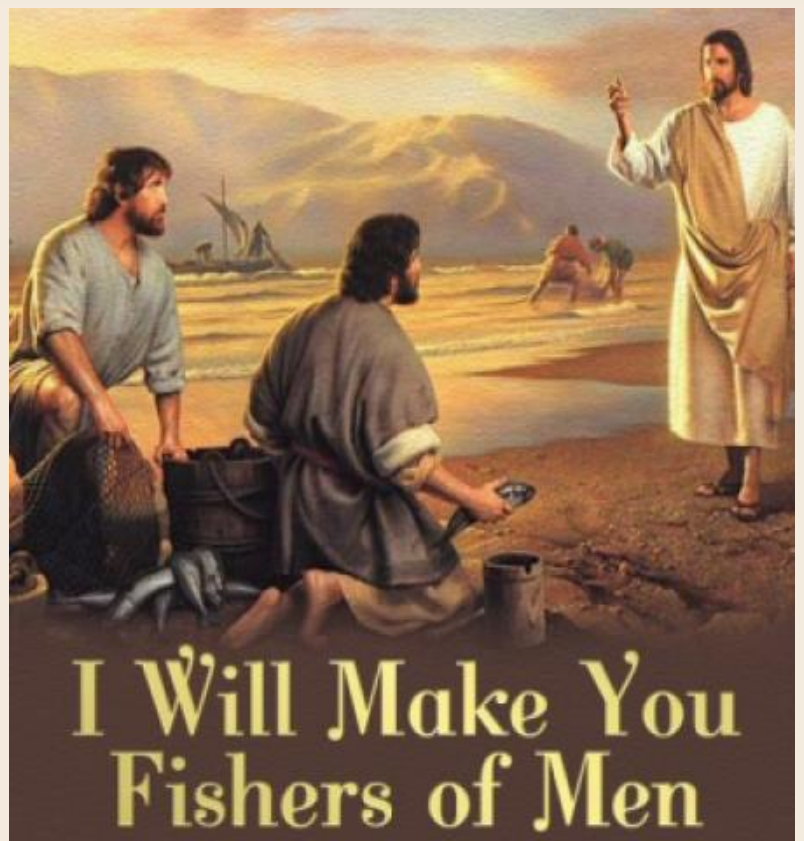

A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

A couple of holidays coming up have been substantially changed this year. This reflects needed adjustments due the ongoing concerns of the pandemic and should not be seen as a permanent change in practice.

Firstly, on the feast day of Saint Blaise, February 3, our tradition for individual throat blessings will change. Due to concerns about social distancing, contact with the candles, and the minister speaking in close proximity to the recipient of the blessing. The blessing will be given to the assembly as a group.

The Book of Blessings says this... "If, for pastoral reasons, each individual cannot be blessed with the use of candles, a priest or deacon may give the blessing to all assembled by extending hands, without the crossed candles, over the people while saying the prayer of blessing."

The other change, per the Diocese, involves Ash Wednesday, February 17. Any person-to-person contact must be avoided. Ashes should be sprinkled on top of the person's head rather than making the sign of the cross on the forehead.

While marking the forehead is our custom, placing the ashes on top of the head is a legitimate option. The Roman Missal only

says that the minister "places ashes" (imponit cineres), but does not specify how.

Sprinkling ashes on the top of the head recalls the biblical practice of putting on "sackcloth and ashes" as an act of penance. For example, we read in the Book of Nehemiah: "On the twenty-fourth day of this month, the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust" (Nehemiah 9:1).

While the custom in the USA has been to mark the forehead with a cross, sprinkling the ashes on the head remains the custom in other parts of the world, such as Spain and Italy. However the ashes are received, the interior repentance expressed by this exterior act is at the heart of the action.

Those who do not wish to be sprinkled with Ash should remain in your seat. No one will judge you! It is the mind of repentance that makes Ash Wednesday special and important. Ashes are symbolic, but it is your inner repentance that the Lord desires during Lent.

Lent will be upon us before you know it (Feb. 17 in Ash Wednesday), so I thought you should know about these changes as soon as possible.
