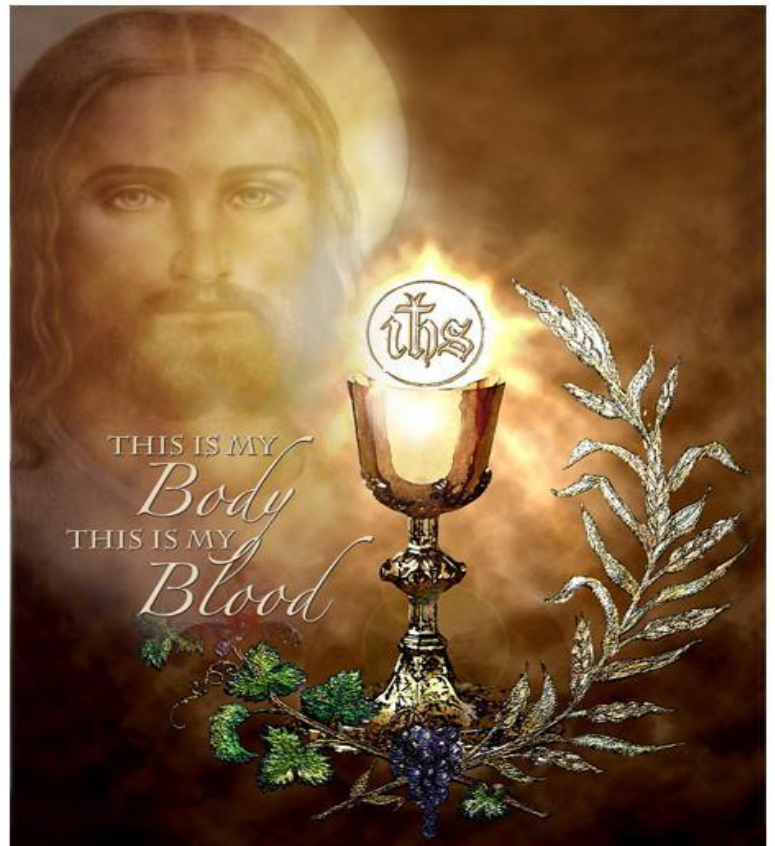

A REFLECTION

FROM DEACON ALBERT

More than two thousand years later, we gather to do what the Apostles did in the upper room on the night of the last supper. On this special feast called Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) we shall do what the Lord commanded, take and eat, take and drink. Today in this church in the twenty-first century, just like in the first century and all those centuries in between.

The details differ, from the upper room to the different churches down thru the centuries, to this church. But the reality is the same, that one basic truth that was expressed simply and profoundly by Jesus. “This is My Body, this is My Blood.” Incredible words that not all could accept. Jesus once told His followers, “Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you have no life in you.” For many of His disciples, this was too much. They drew back and no longer walked with Him. “How can this Man give us His flesh to eat?”

The Jews that Jesus was addressing had gathered to ask him for more bread. Jesus promised to give them the sacramental bread and blood instead. But in their worldly frame

of mind they could not understand or appreciate the sacrament. They disputed among themselves, again “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” Jesus reaffirmed that “My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink”. They ended up distancing themselves from the Eucharist because the sacramental language makes no sense to people in a materialistic frame of mind.

The same problem that these early would-be followers of Jesus had is still with us today. If we approach the Eucharist with a materialistic mentality we fail to understand and so lose the benefits of such a wonderful gift of God’s love. The Eucharist is true food and drink but at the same time it is very different from every other food and drink. The great difference lies in these words of Christ which St Augustine heard in prayer, “You will not change me into yourself as you would food of your flesh; **but you will be changed into me.**” We transform ordinary food into our own bodies but the food of the Eucharist transforms us into the body of Christ. The old saying that we become what we eat is never more true than in the Eucharistic experience.
