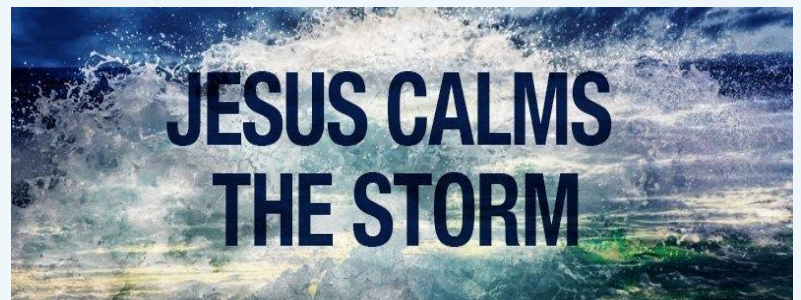
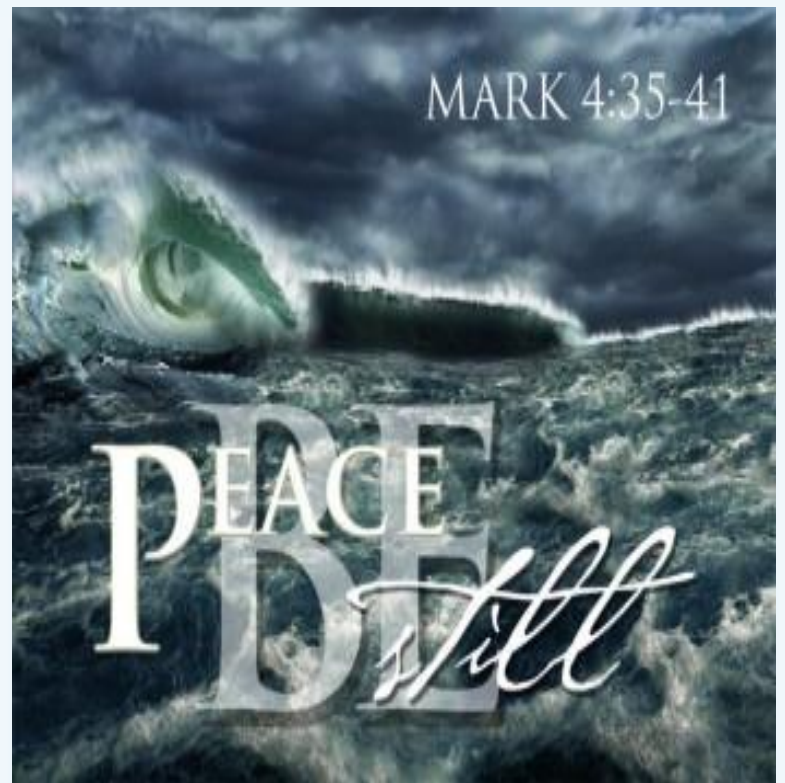

# A REFLECTION

FROM FR. JOHN

In today's Gospel a squall overtakes the boat filled with Jesus and the disciples and threatens to sink the boat. The disciples were beside themselves with fear and they wake up Jesus, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Of course Jesus did care, and he ordered the sea to be silent and all were saved.

Then Jesus asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" This seems to be a stinging rebuke for their lives were constantly in the hands of God. When I read this Gospel, several things came into my mind. Are our dwindling collections enough to keep our Church in the black? Can we meet our CPC obligation this year when last year we came up very short? Who will help me run the Church when there is so much to do, especially without collection counters, weed-pullers, lectors, and so forth?

All these concerns are human concerns that spiritually we must rely on God to help us solve. Nevertheless, I pray for these human matters constantly, "Teacher do you not care we are perishing?" This passage directly confronts my all too human fears and the response of Jesus is as valid today as it was 2000 years ago, "Why are you terrified? Do you not have faith?"

The Community Kitchen had an extremely difficult time adjusting to pandemic conditions and now transitioning to post-pandemic conditions. Some weeks, workers have been scarce and some weeks workers from other area churches have outnumbered our St. Mary workers three-to-one. Again, like the other things I have reflected, these are human concerns. We are serving over 200 meals for carryout, and the day may come where we have to consider what we might do differently to continue that ministry for the poor. If you have ever considered volunteering for Monday late afternoon, or early evening, I assure you that you would be welcomed with open arms.

I am reminded that Jesus said, "Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span?" (Matthew 6:27) This should cue me to not dwell on circumstances beyond our control. We have faith. And although we might be concerned about the day-to-day operations, we cannot be terrified. For our faith is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
