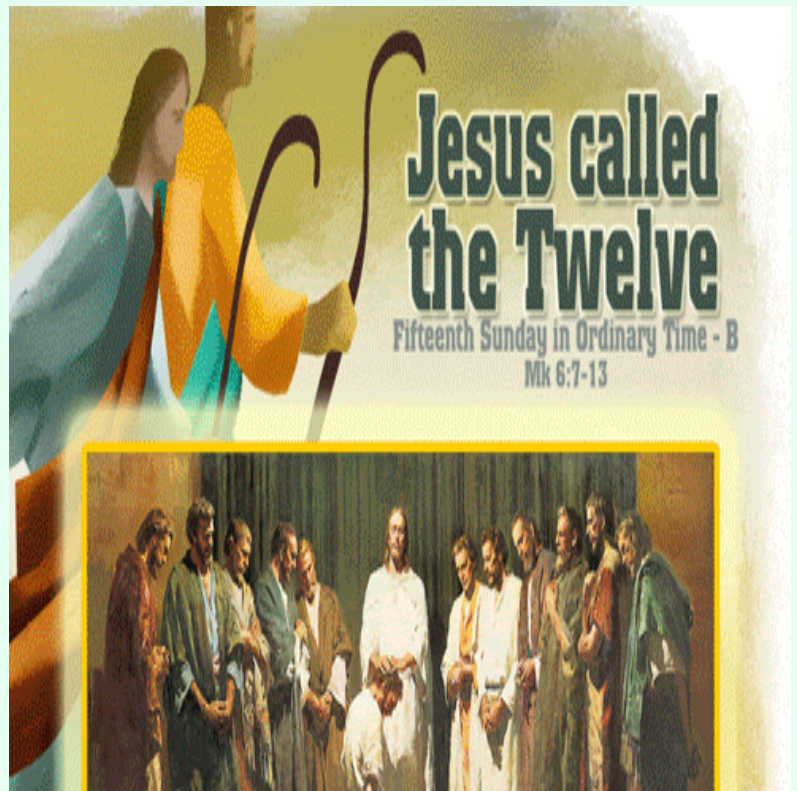

DID YOU KNOW?

Wednesday, this week, is the Memorial of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. Saint Kateri was born into the Mohawk people in the seventeenth century. Her name given, Tekakwitha, translates roughly as “she who bumps into things.” Her parents were a Mohawk chief and an Algonquin woman who was captured and assimilated into the tribe, eventually as his wife.

Her mother was baptized Catholic at a young age and educated by French missionaries. Mohawk warriors captured her and took her to Mohawk lands. The Mohawk people captured natives of many tribes as they attempted to repopulate their land after severe outbreaks of smallpox and measles. As a child of some four years old, Tekakwitha lost her parents and baby brother to smallpox. She was adopted by her uncle and his clan.

Tekakwitha covered much of her head with a blanket to hide her smallpox scars. She lived in a communal longhouse and became skilled at traditional women’s arts. Tekakwitha took part in traditional seasonal gardening. In 1666 AD, the French drove the Mohawk people from their homes, burning entire villages. Tekakwitha and her family fled into a cold October forest.

The village was relocated and a peace treaty required the people accept Jesuit missionaries into their villages. When Tekakwitha was 11 years-old, she met three Jesuit missionaries but her uncle limited her contact for fear of losing her to a Catholic Mission village.

When asked to marry around the age of thirteen, she refused. About that time Mohican warriors began attacking the Mohawk in a siege that lasted three days. As a thirteen-year-old girl Tekakwitha joined with other girls to help a Catholic priest tend the wounded, bury the dead, and bring food and water to the warriors.

By the time she was 17, her family had tried every way they might imagine to get her to marry, but she refused. Eventually her family gave up and accepted her vow of virginity. At the age of 18, bedridden for a hurt foot, she began to study the Catechism of the Church with Jesuit priest, Father Lamberville. At nineteen, she was baptized as Katherine (Kateri) and she moved to the Jesuit mission.

Saint Kateri was known to sleep on thorns while praying for the conversion of family and for forgiveness. She lived in the mission the remaining two years of her life in the service of God, and a priest wrote Kateri said this...”I have deliberated enough. For a long time, my decision on what I will do has been made. I have consecrated myself entirely to Jesus, son of Mary, I have chosen Him for husband, and He alone will take me for wife.” When she died, her last words are reported as, “Jesus, Mary, I love you.” Witnesses claim the pock marks mysteriously disappeared after her death and her face became “radiant.”

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.

SAINTS FUN FACTS by mario d. macari

BLESSED KATERI TEKAKWITHA, A YOUNG MOHAWK INDIAN WOMAN, WOULD CIRCLE A CORNFIELD WHILE PRAYING THE "HAIL MARY" IN HER NATIVE TONGUE DURING THE BITTERLY COLD WINTER OF 1679.

AS A YOUNG GIRL, SHE HAD LEARNED THE PRAYER FROM HER MOTHER BEFORE BEING ORPHANED, SCARRED AND NEARLY BLINDED BY A SMALL POX EPIDEMIC. SHE WAS THEN RAISED BY HER UNCLE, THE TRIBE'S CHIEF WHO RESENTFULLY OPPOSED HER FLEDGING CHRISTIANITY. SHE WAS BAPTIZED AGAINST HIS WISHES, REFUSED TO MARRY AND WAS PERSECUTED BY HER TRIBE.

YET, THROUGH IT ALL, SHE CONTINUED TO OFFER HER EFFORTS TO OUR LORD AS PENANCE.
